This means that we haven't lost the numbers of Clinicians A new pharmacist, Darshna Modha, from Twyford surgery joined us recently. She will be working 2 days a week with us & 1 day at New Wokingham Road. This means that we have 1 vacancy for a receptionist to cover Gabby who retired.

8. Report back from the Healthwatch Annual Report at the Crown Plaza Hotel (Reading)

RB & MM went to this meeting, there was a lady from Reading Borough Council & one from Wokingham Council as well who was talking about co-ordination & the lady from Reading was talking about a project they are working on in one section of Reading, it seemed that they were having to teach parents how to brush their teeth so that they could work with their children on this area.
